Quick Reference Sheet— Crisis Support for the I/DD Population

When engaging with individuals with I/DD...

- Give space, do not touch the individual if possible
- Look for personal ID
- Ask the caretaker (if present) how you can help
- Keep your movements slow
- Do not insist on eye contact
- Remove stimuli causing stress (flashing lights, dogs, loud noises)
- Demonstrate, if possible, what you are going to do
- Tell them what you are going to do before you do it
- Allow time for the individual to process your requests
- Be direct, literal, and concrete in your statements and actions
- Use pictures when possible, if needed
- You may need to rephrase your question and ask it in different ways to ensure that answers are remaining consistent
- Regularly check for understanding throughout the interaction
- Be concise in your language

I/DD:

Developmental Disability (DD) is an umbrella term including intellectual disability (ID). ID are not mutually exclusive to DD. ID is characterized by significant limitations in both intellectual functioning and in adaptive behavior.

Autism:

A developmental disorder of variable severity that is characterized by difficulty in social interaction and communication and by restricted or repetitive patterns of thought and behavior.


